	<p><b>Margoth Viviana ; Birthday: 8<sup>th</sup> March 1994; Grade: Tercero de bachillerato (13th) *</b></p> <p><i>Margoth is a very articulate young woman with leadership qualities. She is the 6th child in her family. She told us their family land was taken away rendering them homeless and poor. It will be a moment of pride for all of us and her family when she graduates this year. DFC has supported her since 2010. (* Secondary school is comprised of 8th-10<sup>th</sup> grades and 11<sup>th</sup> - 13<sup>th</sup> grades)</i></p>
	<p><b>Zenaida Judith; Birthday: 1995; Grade: Octavo de basico (8th)</b></p> <p><i>Zenaida is a charming young lady. She is married to Roberto Chimbo, a Rainforest Scholar during the program's first year. Some of us stayed with her and her mother-in-law during a home stay in Rio Blanco in 2008. She has two children. Zenaida only recently returned to school to finish her education. DFC has supported her since 2010.</i></p>
	<p><b>Erika Natalia; Birthday: 23<sup>th</sup> June 1993; Grade: Decimo de basico (10th)</b></p> <p><i>Her father, Sebastian, is a subsistence farmer. With an annual income of \$360, he is supporting a family of seven children. Like most of the Rainforest Scholars, Erika comes from the Rio Blanco community. DFC has supported her since 2010.</i></p>
	<p><b>Yalic Zandy ; Birthday: 12<sup>th</sup> Dec ember1997; Grade: Decimo de basico (10th)</b></p> <p><i>She was born in the small town of Archidona, the home town of many of the settlers of Rio Blanco. Her mother suffered a major illness several years ago; the treatment and medicines have been a financial strain on the family. Yalic is the youngest of the children. Her parents are very supportive of her education. Although still quiet, she is becoming quite the young women. DFC has supported her since 2009.</i></p>



*Elsa Maricela; Birthday: 24<sup>th</sup> August 1986, Grade: Segundo de bachillerat (12th)*

*As the fourth child among seven, she did not immediately continue on to high school outside the community. Eventually she married and had 2 children, but she was widowed and returned to live with her parents. She returned to school in 2007 with the support of Alliance Exchange. She recently married the elementary school teacher in Río Blanco and they have a new baby. We saw her in January 2010. She is thriving. DFC has supported her since 2009.*

The AlliancExchange board of directors is enthusiastic about its partnership with the DFC and its contribution each year to the Rainforest Scholars Program. We believe we are doing important work together. Education is the key to eradicating poverty. And today only 15 percent of the young people of rural Ecuador complete high school. We are very excited about the work we do together and how together we help the Kishwa women of the Rainforest to lead an empowered life.

Thank you again for your generosity. We look forward to keeping you abreast of each young women's progress and our meetings with them during the October Journey to Ecuador. At next year's conference we envision opportunities to continue to grow the program with DFC and Friends support.
